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## SECTION 1 COMMUNITY RESOURCES

## 1.1 COMMUNITY RESOURCE ASSISTANCE

In the event of a major disaster, assistance from organizations within the community where the disaster has taken place may be needed. This help may be in the form of personnel to aid in manning shelters, providing feeding operations, food preparation, etc. In addition to church organizations, organizations in the Chapter's area which could provide this type of assistance include, but not limited to, various Arm Forces service clubs (American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars), Lions, Jaycees, and Rotary club. Table 1-1 provides a list of these organizations within the chapter's area along with their address and phone number.

#### SECTION 2 EMERGENCY RESPONSE AGENCIES

#### 2.1 RESPONSE AGENCIES

This section identifies the various city and county officials and agencies responsible for emergency response operations and to whom the Red Cross disaster response team must work with when responding to any disaster. The agencies/persons to be contacted/worked with will depend on disaster:

- a. Type
- b. Size/magnitude
- c. Location of the disaster.

The following tables identify the county and city emergency response personnel/agencies within the Rice-Le Sueur Counties Chapter area:

- e, Table 2-2 County Emergency Response Contacts
- f. Table 2-3 City Emergency Response Contacts

During level II or higher disasters where a Red Cross disaster team is assembled, coordination with these agencies/ persons will normally be handled by the Red Cross Public Relations Liaison function. For small disasters (single family fires, etc.) where only a single or a few Red Cross personnel are dispatched this coordination will be handled by the Red Cross person in charge of handling the response.

#### SECTION 3 HOSPITALS

## 3.1 AREA HOSPITALS

This section identifies the various local hospitals to whom the Red Cross disaster response person/team most likely will interface with in responding to a disaster. The hospital(s) to be that could be involved will depend on disaster:

- a. Type
- b. Size/magnitude
- c. Location.

Table 3-1 lists the hospitals most likely to be involved if needed during a disaster operation in the Rice-Le Sueur Counties chapter area.

## SECTION 4 FACILITIES

#### 4.1 FACILITY REQUIREMENTS

During a level II or higher disaster operation many of the services provided by the Red Cross require the use of a facility to maintain the disaster service operations. One or more buildings could be utilized for these various services depending on the availability, size, and configuration of the building(s) and needs of the disaster operation. The Red Cross services requiring facilities fall into four (4) major categories:

- a. Red Cross Headquarters The main headquarters for all Red Cross operations related to the disaster
- b. Service Center(s) Facility or area for providing family assistance case work, health and mental health services, and damage assessment activities
- c. Shelter(s) Provide living areas, and health and mental health services
- d. Mass feeding Provide meal preparation for feeding victims and workers during the disaster. Provide mass feeding location.

Section 4.6 provides a complete list of facilities identified for use during a disaster operation and the type of services that could be provided by use of that facility.

The chapter shall notify persons effected by the disaster of the various services location(s) and hours/days of operation by:

- e. News releases in the local/area newspapers.
- f. News releases on the local/area radio and TV stations.
- g. Posters placed in and around the disaster area.
- h. Through communications with the local and county governmental agencies handling the disaster (fire and police departments, emergency management teams, etc.).

## 4.2 HEADQUARTERS

During level II or higher disaster operations the Red Cross would establish an Headquarters controlling and directing all Red Cross activities. This facility would be under the direction of the chapters' assigned Job Director. Depending on the size of the disaster operation and facilities availability, the headquarters could be located either in a facility by itself or co-located in a facility with other functions. In the later case headquarters operation should have a separate area (room(s)) from the other function(s).

#### 4.3 SERVICE CENTERS

When it becomes necessary for the chapter to open a service center due to a disaster, the chapter will arrange for a location as close to the immediate area of the disaster as possible. Due to the size and disbursement of the population of the residence of the Rice Le Sueur Counties chapter area it is impossible to specify one location(s) to be the chapter's service center(s). All local governmental agencies in the chapter's area of responsibility are capable and supportive of any and all disaster aid efforts. When the need for a service center arises a location will be selected by the chapter's disaster assigned Job Director

## 4.4 DETERMINING SHELTERING REQUIREMENTS

The Red Cross does not make the determination if a victim's housing is livable or not. This determination will be the responsibility of the local governmental agencies involved in handling the disaster (fire department, Emergency Management Director or city official). When the determination that the victim's housing is not livable the chapter will insure the victims are offered temporary housing arrangements.

In disasters where person(s) are displaced from their homes, it may become necessary for the Red Cross to provide lodging or shelters (mass living quarters). Normally this mass care housing will be provided at a location close to, but outside of, the immediate disaster area.

For small disasters, such as single or multiple (apartment) family fires, where less then 10 families are affected, sheltering will be provided at local area motels (see section 7 for motel facilities). In the event of larger disasters, normally with 10 or more families requiring shelter, a mass care shelter may be opened.

## 4.4.1 Mass Care Shelters

The Rice-Le Sueur Counties Chapter area of coverage contains 8 communities with a population of over 500 people and 10 smaller communities of 10 - 500 population. Due to this size and spread of the chapter's population many different potential mass care shelters must be identified in order to provide shelter(s) in the area of the disaster. Normally, in the Rice Le Sueur Counties chapter's area, the most available facility for use is the local school building or church(s). The chapter has identified buildings in all possible communities within the chapter's area which are suitable for use as shelters in case mass care housing becomes necessary. In selecting facilities for use as shelters there are requirements for shelter selection which (when possible) must be considered. These requirements include:

- a. 1 toilet per each 40 persons (6 for 200, 14 for 500)
- b. Minimum of 40 square feet of sleeping space per person
- c. Showers
- d. Separate areas for:
  - 1. Manager's Office area
  - 2.Sleeping
  - 3. Disaster Health Area
  - 4. Disaster Mental Health Area
  - 5. Feeding Area
  - 6.Reception/Registration Area
  - 7. Storage of Food, Supplies and occupant's belongings
  - 8. Child Care
  - 9. Family Service Interview Area
  - 10.Recreation Areas

#### 4.5 MASS FEEDING

In almost any size of disaster operation feeding of victims and possibility of disaster workers also is required. For small disasters, such as single or multiple (apartment) family fires where shelters are not required feeding for victims would be accomplished using local area restaurants (see section 6 for list of restaurants). An extended small disaster operation may require mass feeding in the form of on site feeding using Emergency Response Vehicle (ERV) type operation. These type operations are usually short term requirements.

Feeding of victims and workers on larger disaster operations and where shelters are opened require large mass feeding operations using available kitchens for preparing large quantities of food. When possible shelters with required feeding facilities should be selected whenever possible.

#### 4.6 FACILITIES

The chapter has identified facilities in various locations within the chapter's area which are suitable for use as shelters, Headquarters, service centers and mass feeding operations. The chapter will attempt to maintain written agreements with as many of the identified facilities as possible. In some cases it may be necessary to enter into an agreement with the facilities owner/management at the time of the disaster. Table 4-1 lists buildings identified for use for Red Cross operational uses (Service Centers, Headquarters, etc.). Table 4-2 lists the facilities identified for use as shelters and mass feeding.

#### SECTION 5 MEDICAL

#### 5.1 MEDICAL SERVICES

During the various operations involved in providing Red Cross services during a disaster it sometimes becomes necessary to provide various kinds of medical and nursing aid to disaster victims. The Red Cross does not provide direct medical or nursing aid other then initial consultation and referrals. However, the Red Cross provides aid in the form of referrals to local medical facilities/agencies when a victim appears to require additional medical aid.

In addition, the Red Cross will aid in the emergency replacement of certain medical required items lost due to a disaster. Items such as glasses, prescriptions, and other medical needed items shall be provided on a case by case basis based on immediate need and item availability.

During disaster operations when the disaster nursing coordinator determines a medical item of a disaster victim needs to be replaced immediately, purchases will always be in the form of Disbursement Orders written by the disaster nursing coordinator to the establishment providing the item.

Other areas where referrals or placement of victims may be needed is nursing homes.

Also information on treatment or placement of family pets could be required.

## SECTION 6 SUPPLIES and FEEDING

#### 6.1 SUPPLIES

Normally at the start of a disaster service operation the basic supplies needed for service centers and disaster personnel information processing (Disbursement Orders, 901s, etc.) will be supplied from the chapter disaster response kits.

As required, depending on type and magnitude of the disaster, availability of supplies, length of disasters, etc., it may become necessary to purchase additional supplies. In addition it may be required to provide various types of supplies to disaster victims. These items shall be purchased from local area merchants whenever possible. All purchases shall be made by the issuing of a Disbursement Orders to local merchants. Such items or services which will require these type of purchases include, but not limited to:

- a. Operating supplies for disaster service operations (shelter, service center, etc.).
- b. Groceries for mass feeding.
- c. Prepared food for mass feeding
- d. Vehicle rental

## 6.2 FEEDING

During a disaster relief operation feeding of the victims and Red Cross workers must be provided. The disaster chairperson, with recommendations from the disaster Mass Care Feeding Coordinator, must decide what type and where feeding will be provided. During extended disaster operations, the method of food service may change as the requirements/services availability change. Depending on the number of victims, availability/requirements for mass care shelters, expected length of providing feeding, and other factors, there are several options:

- a. Provide feeding using Mobile feeding Vehicle(s),
- b. Provide feeding in conjunction with a mass care shelter operation,
- c. Provide feeding at local area restaurants,
- d. Combination of the above.

#### 6.2.1 MOBILE FEEDING VEHICLES

The chapter does not have a mass feeding vehicle but several chapters in the southern portion of the state have access to one. If the feeding requirements indicate that the use of a mass care feeding vehicle is required, and at the direction of the disaster job director, the chapter liaison person shall contact the state disaster coordinating chapter and arrange for the use of a mass feeding vehicle.

#### 6.2.2 FEEDING SITES

In the event that the disaster warrants the opening of mass care shelters all efforts will be expended to use shelters which have the facilities required to provide mass feeding. If shelter(s) are not required but mass feeding sites are still required the sites listed for shelters could be opened for feeding only operations. In the case of a disaster with a limited number of victims requiring shelter care it may be easier to provide the necessary meals either at or from a local area restaurant.

#### 6.3 MERCHANTS

Prior to issuance of Disbursement Orders to any merchant during disaster services operations the disaster Liaison Coordinator (in a major disaster operation) or case worker (for small disaster) shall verify the merchant's willingness to provide these services in conjunction with the Red Cross. The Liaison Coordinator or case worker shall review

with the merchant the method of handling the Red Cross Disbursement Orders by the merchant when the purchases are made, procedure for billing the responsible chapter and expected payment time by the Red Cross.

## SECTION 7 MOTELS

#### 7.1 DETERMINING SHELTERING REQUIREMENTS

The Red Cross WILL NOT make the determination if a victims housing is livable or not. This determination will be the responsibility of the local governmental agencies involved in handling the disaster (fire department, Emergency Management Director or other city official). When the determination that the victims housing is not livable the chapter will insure the victims are offered temporary housing arrangements.

In disasters where person(s) are displaced from their homes, it may become necessary for the Red Cross to provide lodging or shelters (mass living quarters). Normally this mass care housing will be provided at a location close to, but outside of, the immediate disaster area.

For small disasters, such as single or multiple (apartment) family fires, where less then 10 families are effected, sheltering will be provided at local area motels. In the event of larger disasters, normally with 10 or more families requiring shelter, a mass care shelter may be opened (see section 4 for shelter facilities).

#### 7.2 MOTEL LODGING

The Rice-Le Sueur Counties Chapter area of coverage contains 8 communities with a population of over 500 people and 10 smaller communities of under 500 population and many do not have motel units available within their respective communities. Due to this size and spread of the chapter's population, the chapter shall house the victims in the closest/most convenient motel available.

In some cases it may be required to use a motel out of the chapters area of coverage. In all cases the motel shall be contacted to assure availability and willingness of management/owner to provide assistance prior to assigning victims to the motel for lodging.

Table 7-1 lists the motels available for use for sheltering clients in the chapter's area.

## SECTION 8 PUBLIC RELATIONS

## 8.1 PUBLIC RELATIONS CONTACTS

During Red Cross operations for providing services to disaster victims it will become necessary to provide various types and amounts of information via local area media sources. Types of information which might require this method of dissemination include:

- i. Location and times of operation of Red Cross service center(s).
- j. Location of Red Cross shelter(s).
- k. Media information on types of Red Cross services being provided.

Table 8-1 provides a list of area newspapers, radio, and TV stations available to provide this type of service to the Red Cross. Any and all inquiries from news media of any type (radio, newspaper, TV, etc.) requesting information on Red Cross services being provided during a disaster or persons inquiring about disaster victims shall be forwarded to the chapter's Public Relations Liaison who shall be responsible for handling these types of inquiries.

#### SECTION 10 OPERATIONAL SUPPLIES & PERSONNEL

#### **10.1 OPERATIONAL KITS**

During any level II or higher disaster operation Red Cross procedures, forms and other material are required. Each function has various Red Cross procedures and form requirements in order to allow Red Cross personnel to initiate each function. The Rice-Le Sueur Counties Chapter maintains 2 "GO KITS" which contain the required Red Cross documents and forms for all functions to initiate a level II (or higher) disaster response operation. Also contained in each kit is required supplies (pens, paper, etc.).

These kits were compiled as the requirements for starting a level II or higher disaster response operation. Additional forms and material may be required dependent on the length of operations. One kit is stored at the chapter office in Faribault and the other with the disaster chairman at his home.

In addition to the "GO" kits the chapter maintains 100 blankets at the chapter office. The chapter has 50 cots located at the Morristown Fire Department. Additional cots and bedding are available from:

- a. National Guard Armory, Faribault arrmy Reserve Armory, Faribault
- b. Le Sueur County EMD, Le Center
- c. Northfield Safety Center

In addition a nursing kit is assembled and stored with the operation "GO" kit at the office.

#### **10.2 RESPONSE TEAM MEMBERS**

The members of the Rice-Le Sueur Counties Chapter disaster response team varies as persons move, retire or join the team. Updated rooster is provided to team members at each team meeting as required. Up to date team membership list is maintained at the chapter office and with the disaster chair. List includes team members name, address, phone number (home, work and cell), and e-mail address.

#### **10.3 ASSISTANCE PRICE LIST**

The chapter follows the Standardized Emergency Assistance Price List, form ARC 4416, provided by national.

#### **10.4 MAPS**

Available street maps and county plat books are contained in the disaster response kits. In addition all first responders are supplied with maps.
